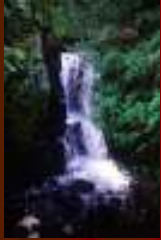

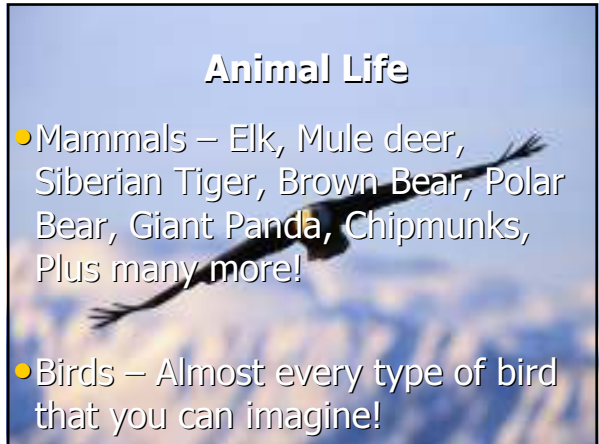

Trees

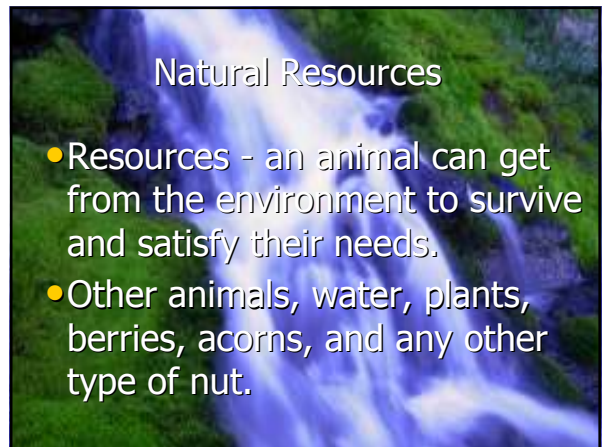
- Evergreens, Chiefly Balsam Fir, Black Spruce, Jack Pine, White Spruce.
