<p>Canine Companions for Independence</p>	<p>Canine Companions for Independence is a non-profit organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing highly trained assistance dogs and ongoing support to ensure quality partnerships. <p>Chrysalis</p>	<p>Chrysalis provides residential and day supports for people with developmental disabilities. These supports are generally contracted and funded through DSPD (a Utah State agency). The Residential supports range anywhere from 24-hour care to a "supported living" environment. The Day Supports include a day program environment with job skills training and a recreation focus.</p>	<p>Any type of intellectual or developmental disability with IQ in the borderline range (70) or below. This includes ABI, TBI, MR, etc. We typically follow the same eligibility criteria as DSPD. We support individuals with dual diagnoses (mental illness AND intellectual disabilities), but if the ID/DD is not present (IQ is above the borderline range), and the individual has only been diagnosed with a mental illness (such as ADHD, schizophrenia, etc.), the person may not be eligible.</p>	<p>EMP, IL</p>

<p>Davis Assistive Technology Teams - Davis School District</p>	<p>The Davis Assistive Technology Teams work within the Davis School District to provide assessment and tools for students to increase access to their communication. We then work with the school teams to implement and support students.</p> <p>The main areas we address are: Communication, Writing, Motor, Reading, Organization, Computer Access, and Daily Living. Students are referred to the DATT by any person from the school team (including parents). DATT then facilitates the evaluation with the school team and makes recommendations. <p>Davis School District Special Education Transition Planning Website</p>	<p>Transition planning is a focus on helping students transition from high school to real-life activities, such as employment, further education, and independent living.
