## **Essential Skills**

The priority standards consist of the following skills:

- Geographic Literacy: Application of spatial understanding and landscape interpretation using globes, maps, and photographs.
- Historical Thinking: Demonstration of historical thinking practices including change and continuity
  over time, cause and effect relationships, interpretation of primary and secondary sources, and
  significance of historical events and figures.
- Civic Mindedness: Understanding of civic roles, rights, and responsibilities at various levels: the individual, group, government, and global.
- Economic Understanding: Knowledge of economic concepts and elements of financial literacy.

## Content

The essential skills are taught, practiced, developed, and assessed through study of the content as outlined below.

Understand that history is the study of events, people, and places of other times.

- People lived differently in the past but some things have remained the same.
- People from history are remembered and honored for specific reasons.
- Stories contain a variety of key historical figures.
- Families have their own histories.

Demonstrate knowledge of basic physical and human geographical concepts.

- Maps represent places.
- The globe is a model of earth.
- Physical features make places unique.
- Relative location is described using specific terms.

Learn and exhibit traits of good citizenship.

- Rules are important in family, class, and school.
- Working together requires specific qualities.
- People work together to build strong communities.
- The flag and other symbols are important and there are rules about them.

Identify basic economic concepts.

- Humans have needs and wants and they change over time.
- People have different kinds of jobs to earn money for their needs and wants.
- People use money by spending, saving, and sharing.
