JOB SUMMARY

Under the general direction of the Foreman – Grounds/Repair, the Grounds/Repair Technician operates backhoe; installs, maintains and cares for landscaping; installs, maintains and repairs sprinkling systems.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Performs pre-trip inspections.
- Operates backhoe, installing sprinkler lines, landscaping, etc.
- Installs, upgrades, maintains and repairs sprinkler systems.
- Assists in determining supply and equipment requirements; locates vendors, arranges bids, prepares price information form (PIF) for submission to coordinator.
- Operates and maintains mowing and turf-care equipment, including aerators, seeders, and sweepers.
- Operates and maintains district vehicles, including dump trucks and tractors.
- Inspects, picks up, repairs, maintains, and delivers school yard equipment including Big Toys.
- Orders, stocks, and assembles custodial and grounds maintenance parts and equipment.
- Assists with mowing, edging, spraying, fertilizing, tree maintenance, synthetic turf maintenance and repair, irrigation, etc.
- Assists with snow removal, driving a snowplow.
- May assist with supervision of full-time grounds/repair employees (reviews work orders, assists in determining work assignments, inspects work, etc.). May be assigned to supervise crew (i.e., giving work assignments, inspecting work, and instructing in work procedures).
- Assists in development of moving assignments and schedules.
- May assist with arrangements for transportation of part-time workers to and from job sites.
