JOB SUMMARY

Under the general supervision of the HVAC Foreman, the HVAC Technician repairs and maintains heating and cooling systems and associated equipment; services hot water heaters, tanks, and appliances.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

- Calibrates and replaces thermostats, VAV boxes, and ATC panels for comfort control on fan systems and univents.
- Runs plumbing lines for refrigerant, water, gas, condensate, and steam.
- Repairs or replaces recirculating, heating, cooling, and sump pumps.
- Drains, cleans, troubleshoots, repairs, and treats boilers--both steam and water systems (for heating systems).
- Repairs and replaces heating and cooling coils, valves, storage tanks, heat exchangers, steam controls, and trapping systems (for heating and cooling systems).
- Repairs or replaces air conditioner compressors, air compressors, swamp coolers, sawdust collectors, kilns, and other equipment as assigned.
- Troubleshoots fan problems and balances airflow.
- Reclaims and/or recharges air conditioning systems.
- Fabricates, modifies and welds adapters and frames for equipment.
- Installs and repairs sheet metal vents and ducts.
- Troubleshoots electrical problems on boiler, fan, etc.
- Replaces and sizes fuses, heaters, relays, v-belts, and pulleys.
- Replaces bearings in motors and shafts.
- Removes asbestos or maintains coverings.
