Board OKs change to 2019-20 school year calendar Schedule of athletic events necessitates move of fall break

he Board of Education of the Davis School District recently approved moving fall break to Oct. 17-18 on the school year calendar for 2019-20.

Elementary School Director Dr. Helene Van Natter,

who chairs the calendar committee, said originally the calendar was released with fall break scheduled for Oct. 10-11. The change was necessitated when other

Wasatch Front districts scheduled their fall breaks. All chose Oct. 17-18.

"We want to move that now to Oct. 17 and 18, the following week, to align with the rest of the state primarily

because of the sports calendar," she said. "Otherwise our students would be playing on a Friday when they were off and on a Wednesday when they were on and that's disruptive to more families. We know we're going to disrupt some families who have already scheduled their break."
