High school graduation to include senior diploma walk Students may choose celebratory walk or pick-up diploma option

igh schools in the Davis School District will hold a diploma walk for seniors in the days following their virtual graduation ceremony on May 26.

High School Director Dr. Dan Linford explained to the Board of Education that seniors will have the option to walk across a staged area, have their name announced and parents can take photographs.

families, we are capable of delivering the social distancing and social gathering guidelines when we get to the point of diploma awarding."

However, the senior walk does not replace the formal virtual graduation ceremony.

"Our graduation ceremony is a time where we honor all of our graduates at once and formerly have board members accept and declare the graduates," said Linford.

Increasing student engagement during remote learning

s schools have worked through remote learning, the district has seen increasing levels of student participation.

In a five-week period from April 10 to May 8, student engagement increased from 78.5 percent to 83.85 percent.

"As the weeks have pro-

gressed, we've increased our engagement level with students, which shows the effort that our great teachers, administrators and staff members are making," said Superintendent Reid Newey during a board workshop meeting.

"On the other end, it shows the efforts that families are making. This is a huge burden to family interaction.

We have great participation by our families when they weren't expecting to facilitate this type of instruction."

Teachers track interaction levels by noting at least one weekly engagement per student each week, reaching out to families and students who have not engaged in online learning and continuing to make class-level adjustments to remote instruction.
